

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.1000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.1000 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.0958 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.1031 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 27, 2026 AT 1:00 PM AT 13833 Highway 59 N., Splendora, TX 77372.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Commissioners of Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED
AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

residence homestead by Montgomery County Emergency Services District No. 7 this year.
